#### Vermilion Liquors, on buying wine

Terry teaches a class at DACC on the finer points of choosing the right wine for your social event. There are five basic types of wine: red, white, rose, sparkling, and fortified. Each type is then further broken down into classifications. There are seven classifications of red wine, and eleven of white wine. The basic criteria for choosing a wine are its color, and its sweetness or dryness.

Terry's advice is to go with what you like, and not necessarily what the experts recommend. If you are still unsure, Vermilion Liquors has a computer you can use to determine what type of wine is recommended for your particular meal.
