Big Brothers & Big Sisters

Mentoring is lending support, friendship and constructed examples. A mentor encourages, listens, and plays a positive roll to make a difference for someone else, and make a difference in your own life. Mentoring is useful for prevention of teen problems, such as teen pregnancy.

Big Brothers Big Sisters has two types of mentoring programs. Community based mentoring is a one on one situation, requiring about 8 to 16 hours a week and a minimum of two visits per month. School based (K-5th grade) mentoring requires one hour per week, when school is in session. Time is spent with the child in the school. There are currently 30 school based mentors, but the program could use up to 70. If you are interested in either community or school based mentoring, call Joyce at 446-6601.
